

To obtain a postal address:

Go to your local CCAS (Social Services Centre).

Your local CCAS is:

- the CCAS of the town where you live
- the CCAS of the town where you work
- the CCAS of the town where a member of your family lives
- the CCAS of your child's school
- the CCAS of the town where you are registered with a doctor
- the CCAS of the town where you are helped by an NGO

There is a CCAS in every town in France.*

To collect your mail:

Go to the CCAS that has your postal address.

The CCAS will tell you how you can collect your mail.

* CCAS are mandatory in every city that exceeds 1500 inhabitants, they are non-mandatory in smaller cities.

Get a free postal address with a domiciliation service.

You may need a postal address if:

- you experience problems with receiving your mail
- the people you live with can read or take your mail
- you are homeless



You can use this postal address for one year.

After one year if:

- your situation has not changed or
- you still need a postal address



You can reapply.



You can obtain a postal address at a CCAS centre

The CCAS is a **C**ommunity **C**entre for **S**ocial **A**ction (Centre Communal d'Action Sociale).

With a postal address, you can, for example, complete the required paperwork:

- to obtain a passport or national identity card
- to obtain a residence permit or proof of identity
- to apply for accommodation
- to open a bank account
- to claim your family benefit entitlements from the **CAF**. The CAF is the family benefits agency (Caisse d'Allocations Familiales)
- from **France Travail**, the agency for jobseekers
- from the **CPAM** for healthcare.



The **CPAM** is the health service fund (Caisse Primaire d'Assurance Maladie)



- for applications at the **MDPH**, the local agency for people with disabilities (Maison Départementale pour les Personnes Handicapées)
